

"Bringing Back the Backslider"

Scripture: James 5:19-20 (NIV)

Synopsis: Every Christian has the potential to turn away from God's truths. As believers, we are to actively seek out and help those who have wandered from their faith, emphasizing the significance of restoring them to a right relationship with God.

The reality of a backslider:

I.	Anyone	can be	a					

<u>James 5:19</u> – My brothers and sisters, if one of you should wander from the truth and someone should bring that person back,

Every Christian has the potential to turn away from God's truths.

<u>Matthew 7:22-23</u> – Many will say to me on that day, "Lord, Lord, did we not prophesy in your name and in your name drive out demons and in your name perform many miracles?" Then I will tell them plainly, "I never knew you. Away from me, you evildoers!"

<u>Backslider (def.)</u> – A spiritual state of where a Christian knowingly and persistently lives to please and serve self rather than serve Christ.

<u>Matthew 26:34-35</u> (Last Supper) – "Truly I tell you," Jesus answered, "this very night, before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times." But Peter declared, "Even if I have to die with you, I will never disown you." And all the other disciples said the same.

<u>Matthew 26:74-75</u> – Then he began to call down curses, and he swore to them, "I don't know the man!" Immediately a rooster crowed.

Then Peter remembered the word Jesus had spoken: "Before the rooster crows, you will disown me three times." And he went outside and wept bitterly.

There is a real possibility that each of us has the potential of backsliding.

<u>If you intervene in the life of a backslidden Christian, you may</u> keep them from death.

Exodus 32:9-14 — "I have seen these people," the Lord said to Moses, "and they are a stiff-necked people. Now leave me alone so that my anger may burn against them and that I may destroy them. Then I will make you into a great nation." But Moses sought the favor of the Lord his God. "Lord," he said, "why should your anger burn against your people, whom you brought out of Egypt with great power and a mighty

hand? Why should the Egyptians say, 'It was with evil intent that he brought them out, to kill them in the mountains and to wipe them off the face of the earth'? Turn from your fierce anger; relent and do not bring disaster on your people. Remember your servants Abraham, Isaac and Israel, to whom you swore by your own self: 'I will make your descendants as numerous as the stars in the sky and I will give your descendants all this land I promised them, and it will be their inheritance forever.'" Then the Lord relented and did not bring on his people the disaster he had threatened.

When a person is living a life apart from God, they are not very sensitive to the urging of the Holy Spirit.

<u>James 5:20c</u> – ... and cover over a multitude of sins.

It takes love to cover a multitude of sin.

<u>Proverbs 10:12</u> – Hatred stirs up conflict, but love covers over all wrongs.

<u>John 13:35</u> – By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another.

Agape love (def.) – It is doing what is best for the other person rather than doing what is best for yourself.

<u>Romans 5:8</u> – But God demonstrates his own love for us in this: While we were still sinners, Christ died for us.

You will always know whether you are loving based upon how you handle the sin of the one who has backslidden.

<u>Psalm 32:1</u> – Blessed is the one whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.

<u>Psalm 85:2</u> – You forgave the iniquity of your people and covered all their sins.

<u>Romans 4:7</u> – Blessed are those whose transgressions are forgiven, whose sins are covered.

Covering one's sin does not mean to ignore it or to excuse it, it means to forgive it.

When you show grace in the covering your brothers/sisters sin, God will show you grace in covering yours.

2 Corinthians 7:8-9 – Even if I caused you sorrow by my letter, I do not regret it. Though I did regret it—I see that my letter hurt you, but only for a little while—yet now I am happy, not because you were made sorry, but because your sorrow led you to repentance. For you became sorrowful as God intended and so were not harmed in any way by us.

The standard for restoration and renewal is *truth*, not your personal opinion.

<u>James 5:19a</u> – My brothers and sisters, if one of you should wander from the truth ...
